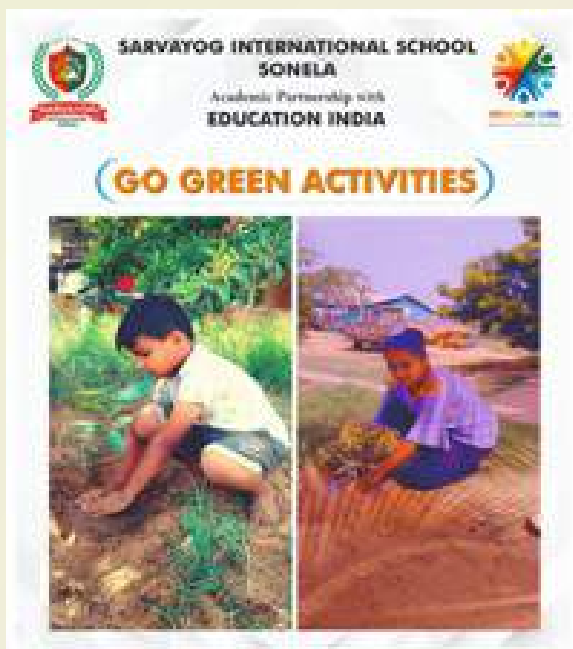
ACTIVITIES

Go Green Activity- "Live life cleaner by making Earth greener"

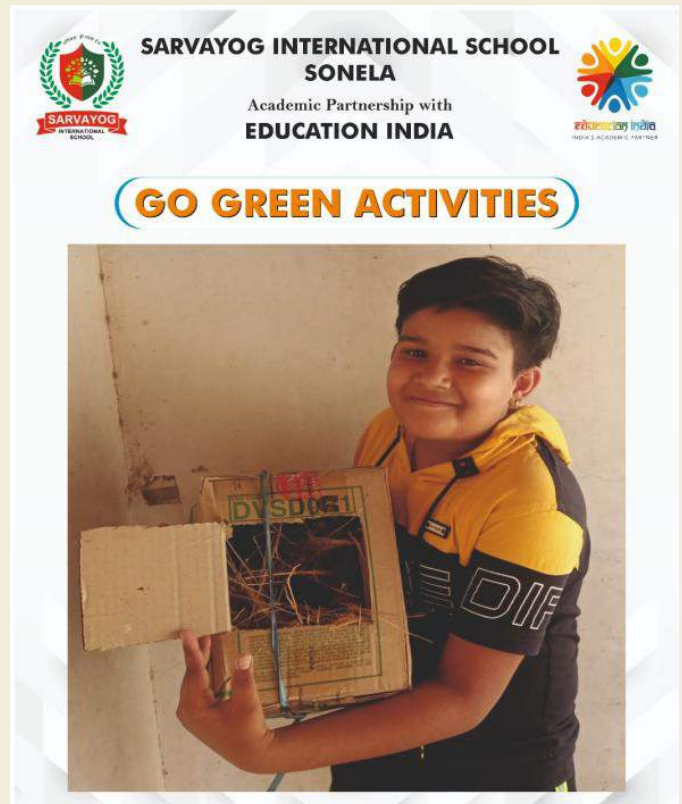

Paper Bag-“Save the Planet”

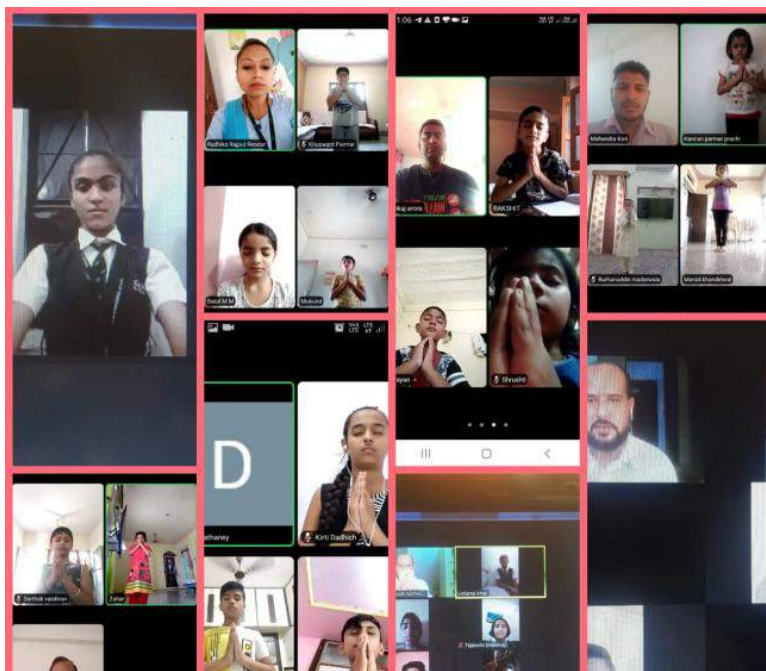

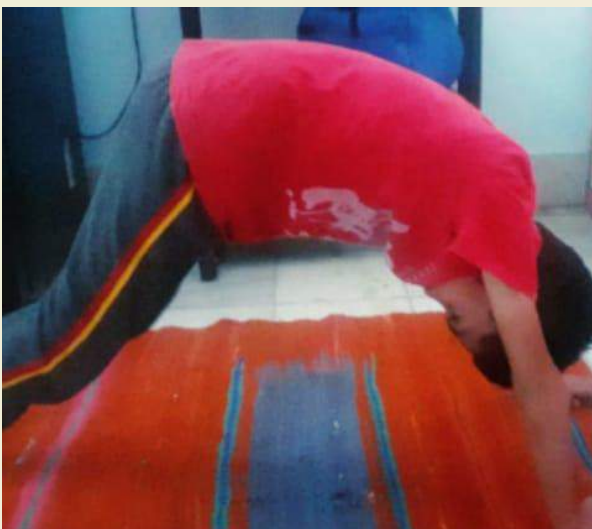


“Yoga, A Way of Life” International Yoga Day Celebration-

International Yoga Day, observed on June 21, honors the physical and spiritual strength that yoga has brought to the world stage. While it is a great source of exercise and healthful activity, millions of people participate and practice it on a regular basis. Many people see these rituals as a method to reconnect the body, mind, and spirit in a way that has existed for ages. The concept of International Yoga Day was first presented by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on September 27, 2014, during his speech at the United Nations General Assembly, where India's Ambassador, Asoke Kumar Mukerji, sponsored a resolution to establish June 21 as International Yoga Day.

On June 21, 2015, nearly 36,000 people, including Prime Minister Modi and many other high-profile political figures from around the world, performed 21 asanas (yoga postures) for 35 minutes in New Delhi to commemorate the first International Yoga Day, which has since been celebrated around the world.

Since then, Sarvayog International School has also observed International Yoga Day. We've been observing Yoga Day virtually since last year. On June 21, 2021, all students participated electronically and practiced yogasanas.

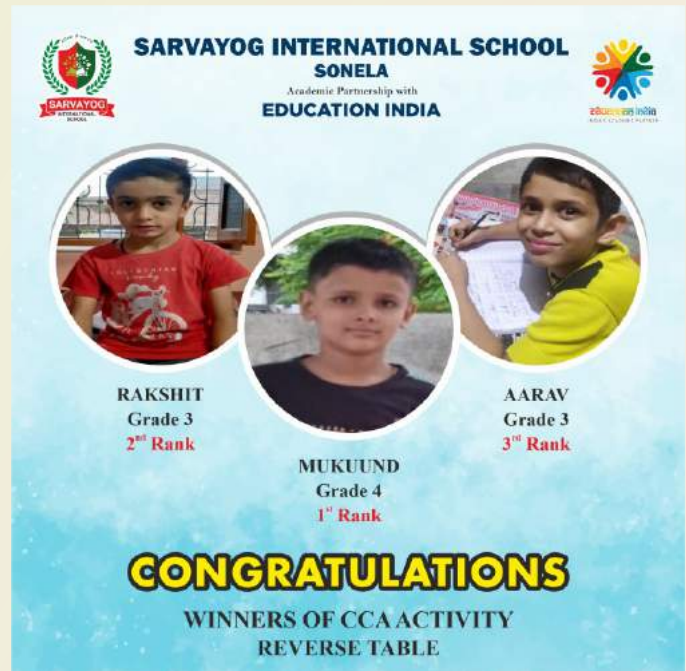


Reverse Tables

Memorizing multiplication tables 1 to 20 serves as a foundation for related Math concepts taught in elementary school such as division, fractions, long multiplication, and algebra. Students will find these topics more difficult to understand if they do not memorize basic multiplication tables. As a result, it is critical that they memorize the math tables.

Our school arranged a Reverse Tables tournament to improve table memorizing so that pupils feel confident when tackling arithmetic problems. Mukund Joshi (Grade 4) was the competition's champion. Rakshit (Grade 3) came in second place. Arav (Grade 3) came in third place.
